Cell phones and electronic games continue to be a problem in the school. Please do not allow your child to bring any electronic games or other toys to school unless the teacher requests it. They are not only a distraction but are often lost or damaged.

If your child needs to have a cell phone for after school use, they must be sure that it is turned off and then given to the homeroom teacher in the morning. The

cell phones will be kept in a basket in the classroom.

Opening of School



School will begin on Thursday, August 26, for students in grades 1-8. Students should report to the cafeteria before 7:50 a.m. Dismissal will be at 11:30 a.m. Beginning on Friday, August 27, the students in grades 1-8 will have a full day of school. Lunch will be served.

The first two days of school will be dress up days for students – no jeans, t-shirts, short skirts, tank tops, or short shorts are permitted. Also, students

must wear ankle socks (socks that cover the ankles), knee socks or hose and wear shoes that are closed in the front and in the back – no sandals or clogs are permitted.

Uniforms must be worn beginning on Monday, August 30. Students may wear uniform shorts. See the dress code information that is included.

Kindergarten students received information about the first day of school from the teachers.

Dress Code

Reminder that girls, with the exception of 8th graders, are to wear the school plaid jumpers or skirts. There are no exceptions. You received a catalog from Lands End with information about school uniforms. If you would like to order from them that is acceptable.

There were a few changes to the dress code last year. Please be sure that you are aware of these changes and follow them.

- ◆ **All shirts/blouses must be tucked into slacks, shorts, or skirts.**
- ◆ **Students in grades 4 – 8 must wear belts if the slacks have belt loops.**
- ◆ **Jumpers, skirts and shorts can be no more than 3 inches above the knee.**
- ◆ **Socks must cover the ankle.**
- ◆ **Boys in grades 1-8 must wear ties to any masses where the entire school is in attendance.**

Protecting God's Children

All parents, coaches, cafeteria volunteers, room parents, library aides, school volunteers, etc. are required to register on the Diocesan Database. Go to www.diopitt.org. Scroll down the left hand side of the page to the "Diocese of Pittsburgh Database Application" box. The diocesan password is "**protect**".

By registering on the Diocesan Database your application for the Criminal Record Check will automatically be submitted. Once that is received at the school you will need to apply for your Child Abuse Clearance. A letter with a copy of your Criminal Record Check and an application for the Child Abuse Clearance will be sent to you by our office. You may then apply for your Child Abuse Clearance. When you receive this certificate from the State, please send a copy to the school.

In addition to registering on the Database, you must also take the course, "Protecting God's Children".

This class is offered in various locations around the diocese. Class dates and times are listed on the Diocesan webpage. Scroll down the page to Diocesan Abuse Prevention Effort and click on. Next click on Protecting God's Children Workshops. This will give a listing of locations, dates and times this workshop will be offered.



The Code of Pastoral Conduct is also required of all volunteers.

After reading the document, print the last page, sign it and send it to the school.
